Chaplain's Corner

Grounded Kids Assembly – Respect

We continued this week's GK Assembly on the topic of respect; Mr. Koh emphasized that "respect is important when talking to adults." This week's lesson was not merely about addressing an adult, but also about communicating one's feelings effectively. Mr. Koh suggested three questions as good starting points when navigating a disagreement or misunderstanding. These questions deescalate situations and can create trust between the student and adult. Additionally, Mr. Koh shared seven helpful practices for students to consider when communicating with adults. We hope these ideas will be reinforced at school, at home, and in interactions with community members or helping professionals. This skill will go a long way in equipping our students to be effective communicators.

Speaking respectfully to adults means:

1. using their title (mr./mrs./miss)
2. Looking at them when you're talking to them.
3. using polite words like please and thank you
4. watching your tone of voice
5. using real words
6. checking your body language
7. not whining or complaining.

What to say when you don't agree with an adult:

1. is there a time that we can talk about this?
2. can you help me understand...?
3. can i explain to you how i feel about this?
